A great deal has happened since the last quarterly report was released. In fact, a first quarter report for 2020 was deemed unnecessary as the data would not have shown much of the impact our country, state, and region, has been experiencing. Instead, the Drew CBEA released a "current standing" report to show where we were at the time in relation to the COVID-19 pandemic. There is also a special section on our website related to COVID-19 related data trends. During this pandemic, the economy has seen record increases in unemployment, unemployment insurance claims, and a national recession officially began in February 2020. There are also a host of other events and data changes that have occurred that could not possibly be covered in one quarterly report.

This issue will focus on the latest available data for the second quarter (when available) which really shows the effects of the crisis. It will also discuss some of the recovery that is underway. Many businesses in the area have taken out loans as a part of the Paycheck Protection Program (PPP) and those are analyzed at the end of the report.

As employment has started to increase as businesses have reopened, we must remember we are still a long way from where we were prior to the pandemic. While there has been growth in the economy, it may take quite a bit longer to fill in the hole caused by the dramatic drop. The state and our region have seen a spike in coronavirus cases and we remain, as of this writing, in Phase 2 of the reopening process where we have been for quite a while.




In the 2nd quarter of 2019, the Lake Charles MSA (consisting of Calcasieu and Cameron parishes) has seen a large decrease in employment compared to the same quarter the previous year. This is no doubt due to the effects of the pandemic shutdowns.

Total nonfarm employment (presented in thousands of jobs in the table) fell by 18,600 jobs over the year for a 16.0% decrease. Looking at the industries shows no industry gained jobs over the year. Due to the pandemic shutdowns and restrictions in place during the second quarter, Leisure and Hospitality experienced the largest percentage drop at 34.4% drop losing 5,200 jobs. Construction fell 5,600 jobs (-22.8%) while Manufacturing lost 1,800 jobs (-17.0%). Professional and Business services lost 1,300 jobs for a 12.4% drop. Trade, Transportation, and Utilities lost 1,300 jobs (-7.2%) and

government lost 1,300 jobs (-8.4%).

This large loss in employment also saw large drops in earnings measures. Average weekly earnings of all employments fell 9.2% while average hourly earnings fell 4.6%. Although not shown, average weekly hours of all employees in the second quarter fell 4.8% over the year.















The quarterly average unemployment rate in the MSA currently sits at 12.7% which represents a 9 percentage point increase from a year ago. Lake Charles currently has the lowest unemployment rate of all MSA's in the state. The household employment measure fell by 17,847 over the year in the 2nd quarter for a 16.7% decrease. The number of unemployed increased by 8,808. This represented a dramatic 208.8% increase. As the labor force is the total of unemployed and employed, the total change in the labor force was a drop of 9,039.

Job openings in the 2nd quarter of 2020 averaged 3,875. Openings fell by 1,695 (30.4%) over the year.


Overall, both the household and nonfarm employment measures show the MSA had been falling slightly (mainly



due to construction projects finishing), but took a dramatic drop in the second quarter due to the pandemic. Many lost jobs and the unemployment rate dramatically rose.





The housing statistics show that prices in the area were rising slightly faster than the state but slower than the nation from 2014 - 2018. Looking at price changes overthe-year, from the first quarter of 2019 to the first quarter of 2020, housing prices have risen 4.4% in the Lake Charles MSA compared to 4.3% in LA and 5.2% in the US.

Housing Permits - Lake Charles MSA



In the second quarter of 2020, single unit permits fell by 25 over-the-year while multi-unit permits fell by 24 bringing the total drop to 49. This represented a 19.6% decrease. The YTD figures show a drop of 25 in single unit and 16 for multi-unit bringing the total decrease to 41. The percentage change for total permits YTD was 15.1%. In terms of valuation, single unit permits fell \$8.6 million while multi-unit permit valuations fell \$2.3 million for a total decrease of \$10.9 million. This represented a 24.1% drop year-over-year in the 2nd quarter of 2020 for valuation of all permits. In terms of YTD numbers, the total year-over-year change in valuation for single unit permits was a drop of \$12.2 million while the drop in multi-unit permits was \$1.5 million leading to a total drop in valuation of \$13.7 million.

The percentage change in valuation for all permits YTD was a decrease of 15.1%.



For these quarterly reports, passenger and flight statistics from the Department of Transportation are generally used. However, these usually have a much longer lag and would tell us nothing about the crucial second quarter. The Lake Charles Regional Airport has graciously shared ISA checkpoint data which serves as a proxy for the number of passengers leaving the airport. The graph to the left shows the number of people entering through the check point each day since the beginning of March 2020.

The Lake Charles regional airport has seen a dramatic drop in the number of passengers due to the pandemic. People passing through the TSA checkpoint in the 1st quarter of 2020 decreased 1,139 (-8.5%) compared to the 1st quarter of 2019. This decline was exacerbated as the pandemic began to hit harder throughout the second


quarter. The number passing through TSA checkpoint in the 2nd quarter of 2020 decreased 11,457 (-70.4%) since the 2nd quarter of 2019. Looking at the July figures shows that there has been a considerable uptick. This is good news, but more time is need to see how long it will take to reach pre-pandemic levels.




The Lake Charles port has seen falling export and import values over the past two years as shown in the graph above. The figures in the table below show the value of exports fell \$1.3 billion (-52.1%) over the year while the total value of imports fell \$648 million (-69.4%). The total weight of all exports fell 4.5 billion kg (--52.9%) while the total weight of all imports fell 1.3 billion kg (-52.4%).

Gaming establishments were shut down from the first half of March through the second half of May. Since that time, they've been operating at reduced capacity. This has all led to drops in gaming revenue (and admission) in the 1st and 2nd quarters of 2020. Total revenues in SWLA for the 2nd quarter of 2020 fell \$319 million for a 58.2% decrease compared to the same quarter the previous year.

Isle of Capri experienced an absolute drop of \$15 million for a 61.7% decrease over-the-year. L'Auberge had an absolute drop of \$41.4million for a 55.2% decrease. Delta Downs experienced a \$25.1 million drop in AGR over the year for a 54.3% decrease. The Golden Nugget had an annual percentage drop in AGR of 49.2% with absolute decreases of \$38.3 million.

The four casinos in the region saw a sharp increase in the share

of total state revenues. The four SWLA establishments made up 45.2% of the total AGR from riverboats and slots and tracks in the state. The largest share of SWLA AGR in the 2nd quarter of 2020 came from Golden Nugget which equaled 38.2%, followed closely by L'Auberge at 32.4%.











In the 2nd quarter of 2020, Allen parish saw a decrease in the labor force of 289 (-3.3%). This was broken down by an increase in household unemployment of 726 over the year (+155.4%) while the number of employed persons fell 1,015 (-12.1%) over the year. The unemployment rate rose 8.7 percentage points over the year to 14%.

Job openings in the 2nd quarter of 2020 averaged 139. Openings fell by 18 (-11.3%) over the year.

The graphs show the levels of household employment, unemployment, and the unemployment rate for each quarter compared to the same quarter the previous year.




In the 2nd quarter of 2020, Allen has had higher unemployment and lower employment figures, representing a decreasing labor force overall.

The graph to the left shows the amount of new business filings each quarter compared to the same quarter in the previous two years.


The number of new business filings in Allen parish was 22 in the 2nd quarter of 2020 which was the same to the same quarter in 2019 and 5 more compared to the same quarter 2 years ago. The YTD total for the 2nd quarter of 2020 was 44. This was 4 businesses higher than the 2nd quarter of 2019 YTD and 1 business lower than the 2nd quarter of 2018 YTD.

Allen parish has had an increase in SNAP recipients, households and benefits over the year. The parish had an average of 4,386 recipients of SNAP benefits in the 2nd quarter of 2020. 236 more people received benefits compared to the 2nd quarter of 2019 for a 5.7% increase over this time. The total number of households receiving SNAP was 1,973 which was 143 more than the same quarter in the previous year. This represented a 7.8% increase. In terms of benefits, the parish received \$771.8 thousand in total during the 2nd quarter of 2020, which was a \$274.4 thousand increase over-the-year. This was a 55.2% rise in benefits in the parish. Looking at the graph

illustrates over the past two years an overall decreasing trend in benefits before a sharp rise due to the effects of the COVID-19 pandemic.







Tax Collections

The Drew CBEA has begun building a history of Allen Parish sales tax collections with the help of the Allen Parish School Board. The numbers show clear upward movement throughout most of the year.

Compared to the 2nd quarter of 2019, Allen parish has seen an overall increase in tax collections in the 2nd quarter of 2020. Total tax collections increased \$617.2 thousand for an 18.6% increase. This is mainly due to increased shopping during COVID and an one percentage point increase in the sales tax rate in Allen Parish that occurred on July 1, 2019. The lower sales tax rate was in effect through the first two quarters of 2019.




In the 2nd quarter of 2020, Beauregard parish saw a drop in household employment of 1,532 over the year (-11.0%)


while the number of unemployed persons rose 581 (+82.2%) over the year. This led to a drop of 951 (-6.5%) in the total labor force. The unemployment rate rose 4.6 percentage points over the year to 9.5%.

Job openings in the 2nd quarter averaged 183. Openings fell by 35 (-16.2%) over the year.

The graphs show the levels of household employment, unemployment, and the unemployment rate for each quarter compared to the same quarter the previous year. In the 2nd quarter of 2020, Beauregard has had higher unemployment and lower employment figures, representing a falling labor force.










Beauregard Parish

The graph shows the amount of new business filings each quarter compared to the same quarter in the previous two years.

The number of new business filings in Beauregard parish was 42 in the 2nd quarter of 2020 which was 13 less than the same quarter the previous year and 6 less compared to the same quarter 2 years ago. The YTD total for the 2nd quarter of 2020 was 101. This was 29 less businesses than the 2nd quarter of 2019 YTD and 2 businesses higher than the 2nd quarter of 2018 YTD.



Beauregard parish has had a sharp increase in SNAP recipients, households and benefits over the year. The parish had an average of 5,492 recipients of SNAP benefits in the 2nd quarter of 2020. 867 more people received benefits compared to the 2nd quarter of 2019 for a 18.8% increase over this time. The total number of households receiving SNAP averaged 2,454 which was 424 more than the same quarter in the previous year. This represented a 20.9%




increase. In terms of benefits, the parish received an average of \$898.8 thousand in total during the 2nd quarter of 2020, which was a \$334.6 thousand increase over-the-year. This was a 59.3% rise in benefits in the parish. Looking at the graph illustrates over the past two years an overall decreasing trend in benefits before a sharp rise. This trend is also shown in the number of households and recipients receiving benefits. The pandemic has led to more people receiving a greater number of benefits.






Tax Collections



Beauregard parish has seen an increase in its sales tax collections in the 2nd quarter of 2020, compared to the same quarter the previous year. Sales tax collections have grown by \$1.5 million over the year for a 21.2% increase. Looking at the entities that receive sales tax distributions shows that DeRidder collects the most revenue. These are sales conducted within the city limits. This category saw a year-over-year increase of \$600.5 thousand (+34.3%) over the year. The other entities all experienced increases in sales taxes. Other categories show the Police Jury collections grew \$46.3 thousand (+3.4%) and PJ Courthouse revenues grew

\$71.8 thousand (+19.4%). School board revenues, All and NM, grew by \$324 thousand (+22.4%) and \$321.8 thousand (+22.7%), resepctively. Merryville collections grew \$8.7 thousand (+10.5%) and BPSO grew \$146.4 thousand (+19.8%) over the year.








In the 2nd quarter of 2020, Calcasieu parish saw a drop in the labor force of 8,531 (-7.9%). This was due to a drop in household employment of 17,207 over the year (-16.7%) while the number of unemployed persons rose 8,676 (+212.8%). 



Calcasieu parish has seen declining taxable sales and sales tax revenues since hitting a major peak in 2017.
Therefore, it is difficult to quantify how much of the drop is due to the continuing trend back to a more normal level and

how much is pandemic induced. However, both are certainly at play. Sales tax collections, plus occupancy, have fallen by \$23.5 million over the year for a 22.4% decrease. General sales taxes fell by \$22.4 million (-21.8%) over the year. Occupancy taxes were intensely hurt by the shutdowns and lack of visitation. These taxes fell \$1.4 million for a 63.6% decrease. This occurred as taxable sales in the parish fell \$433.7 million (-23.7%) over the year. All categories of sales, with one exception, suffered annual declines. The most striking (in percentage terms) were Gaming (-60.1%) and Apparel (-56.1%). Food (separate from Restaurants which experienced a 31.6% drop) was the only category to see an increase (+3.1%) as there were more grocery purchases during the pandemic. This is also reflected in only a slight drop (-5.2%) in General Merchandise.



The graph shows the amount of new business filings each quarter compared to the same quarter in the previous two years.



Calcasieu parish has had an increase in SNAP recipients, households and benefits over the year. The parish had an average of 32,455 recipients of SNAP benefits in the 2nd quarter of 2020. This was 3,683 less people receiving benefits compared to the 2nd quarter of 2019 for a 12.8% increase over this time. 


The largest amount of severance tax collections from Cameron are taxes on oil. Oil tax collections in the 2nd quarter of 2020 fell by \$2.1 million compared to the same quarter the previous year. This represented a 57.7% drop as oil prices fell due to the pandemic and the Saudi-Russian oil price war. In terms of gas collections, those fell \$108 thousand over that period for a 20.9% decrease. Timber product collections have been negligible. Total severance taxes collected form the parish have fallen \$2.2 million over the year in the 2nd quarter of 2020 for an 53% decrease.

The YTD figures show in 2020 there was a substantial drop in total severance taxes collected compared to the previous year. In the 2nd quarter 2020 YTD, severance taxes fell \$3.2 million for growth of -38.4%. As mentioned previously, much of this can be traced to the drop in oil prices and production activity throughout the state and nation.



Cameron parish has had drops in SNAP recipients and households while experiencing a sharp rise in benefits over the year. The parish had an average of 631 recipients of SNAP benefits in the 2nd quarter of 2020. This was 103 fewer people receiving benefits compared to the 2nd quarter of 2019 for a 14% decrease over this time. The total number of households receiving SNAP averaged 268 which was 36 more than the same quarter in the previous year. This represented a 11.9% decrease. In terms of benefits, the parish received an average of \$128.5 thousand in total during the 2nd quarter of 2020, which was an \$41.7 thousand increase overthe-year. This was a 48% increase in benefits in the

Jefferson Davis parish saw an increase in its sales tax collections in the 2nd quarter of 2020, compared to the same quarter the previous year. Sales tax collections have increased by approximately \$150 thousand over the year for a 2.2% increase. This occurred as taxable sales in the parish rose slightly by \$4.7 million (3.8%) over the year. The largest absolute increase occurred in general merchandise (+\$12.4 million, +33.5%). Food also saw an increase of \$800 thousand (+3.3%) as this category includes both groceries and restaraunts. As people began to shop more at grocery and general merchandis stores, the taxable sales exhibitied an overall increase even though other categories experienced drops in asbolute terms. Apparel only saw 67.9% decrease in sales, but this only represented \$1.9 million drop.

The 2nd quarter of 2020 YTD figures show that total taxable sales have increased in the parish by \$4 million compared to the same quarter in 2019 last year for a 1.7% increase. This led to a \$0.2 million increase in sales tax collections (+1.3%).



Paycheck Protection Program in the Five Parish Area

This quarterly report has illustrated the dramatic changes experienced in each of the five parishes in our region. Each parish has had job losses, increases in SNAP participation, and increases in initial and continued unemployment insurance claims (not shown in the report, but available here). The MSA has seen drops in employment, lower trade, tourism and gaming, airport visitation, and housing permits. Our area has followed the nation in the total downturn in economic activity. In response, all levels of government have stepped in to try to help ease some of the hardships faced by citizens. The Federal government first distributed rounds of \$1,200 per person and \$500 dollar per child checks to citizens throughout the country. This program's effects were roughly estimated by the Drew CBEA. The federal government also began the Paycheck Protection Program (PPP). This program distributed loans to businesses that could be transformed into grants if the funds were used for the following; at least 60% of the funds were used for payroll, the remaining allowable uses are rent/lease, utilities and mortgage interest. The PPP was established to help keep employees employed during the pandemic.

According to the <u>latest SBA report</u> through July 31st, there have been 76,832 PPP loans in Louisiana for a total of approximately \$7.4 billion. The SBA also <u>reported</u> that Economic Injury Disaster Loans (EIDL) totaled \$2.3 billion. This means almost \$10 billion has been injected into the Louisiana economy to help with the pandemic's economic effects.

On July 6th, the SBA also released <u>data by state</u> showing the amount of PPP loans taken out by particular businesses. The data is available in two categories. For PPP loans above \$150,000, the business is named and the amount of the loan is not shown. The amount taken per business is only illustrated by a range. For PPP loans below \$150,000, the business is not named but the actual amount is given. For purposes of this writing, analysis will have to be split between these two categories at times.

With help from <u>Louisiana Economic Development</u>, the Drew CBEA was able to map loans taken out to businesses in the five parish area. The data show that approximately 4,000 PPP loans were granted in the five parish area. The majority of businesses receiving loans were located in Calcasieu parish. Most of the loans were taken out by presumably small businesses that borrowed less than \$150,000.

Due to the split in reporting (loans less than \$150,000 exact amount, loans greater than \$150,000 only a range), a precise amount of funds extended cannot be found. However, some valuable statistics related to the totals can be shown. For all the businesses that received loans under \$150,000, the total amount of funds in our region totaled \$120.9 million. The amount taken by a business was about \$34,000 on average.

When looking at businesses that took loans in amounts of \$150,000 or above, the majority of the loans were in the lower ranges for the amount of funds. The results show that almost 60% of the loans above \$150,000 were in the range of \$150,000 - \$350,000. 29% of the loans were between \$350,000 - \$1 million. While 7% were between \$1 million - \$2 million, only 1% (5 in total) were between \$5 million - \$10 million. The largest range, \$2 million - \$5 million, had 14 loans extended within those amounts. While 9 were in Calcasieu, 4 were in Jefferson Davis Parish.

The reported data also shows the amount of jobs retained with each loan. The totals show that about 38,000 jobs were retained. The majority of the jobs were retained from the larger businesses (that employ more people) that took out loans greater than \$150,000.

The table on the previous page shows the number of jobs retained in each industry by parish. Focusing on the totals, the highest number of jobs retained, by far, were in the Health Care and Social Assistance Industry. Large numbers of jobs were also maintained in the Accommodation and Food Services, Construction, and Retail Trade industries.

This data shows that the service sectors of the economy were hit particularly hard in this area and applied for the most assistance during this pandemic. According to the data, almost 4,000 loans were responsible for retaining 38,000 jobs in this area. While no one knows how long this recession will last or how long the recovery will take, we can say that this assistance did help some businesses continue operations and pay employees.
